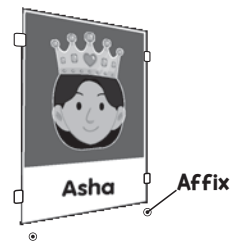


- **2 Gameboards in Red and Blue.**
- **40 Plastic Frames in White Colour (To be Assembled).**
- **3 Sets of Character Cards in red, blue and yellow (20 of each card set).**

**Guess your opponent's character by asking them for clues, before they manage to guess yours.**



yellow cards, 20 blue cards and 20 red cards. The cards are two sided. The back side of each card will have the words FIND ME IF YOU CAN on red, blue and yellow backgrounds. The front side of each card will have a face and a name.

Keep the yellow cards aside and each player picks up either blue or red cards based on their chosen Gameboard colour.

Now slot the red / blue cards in the respective white frames and ensure that the character is facing the player. Make sure each card fits properly inside the white frame.

To make your respective game boards ready for instant play, tilt them away from you so that all the frames become upright and then set the board down on a flat table with all the 20 faces of the characters facing you.

Look at how different the people look and note which are similar.

Is anyone wearing a hat? Glasses or both?

Does anyone have different kinds of hair colour or hairstyles. Some people have yellow hair, red, brown, black and white hair. Some have long hair, short hair, or have a fancy topknot or a bun.

Do you spot anyone with a beard?

Which of these features will you notice after you have played and get to know all your favourite characters?

Place all the characters on your gameboard on the right and you can see all their faces. Turn the cards face down and secretly pick one each and place it on the right of each gameboard. Place a question mark on either of the gameboard slots on the character card a secret.

Take turns asking questions about different features on the characters.

It is your opponent's turn to try and guess who their character is.

You could try asking are: "Do they have white hair?" or "Are they wearing a hat?" The question you ask must be one that can be answered with a simple "yes" or "no". For example you could ask "Do they have a beard?" If your opponent's answers "yes", then you can flip down all the characters that do not have a beard on your gameboard - leaving the ones that do have a beard still standing.

6. Keep taking turns asking questions until you think you know who your opponent's character might be - and when you are really sure, use your next turn to name them.

7. If you guess correctly you are the winner - but be careful because if you guess wrong the other player wins the game.

8. When there is a winner, return your character cards to the pile, give them a little shuffle and start the guessing fun all over again!
